Booking options for the Adult services are as follows:

We have 2 single chairs

9 sets of 2 chairs together

7 sets of 3 chairs together

2 sets of 4 chairs together

1 set of 5 chairs together

This will give us the ability to host 21 individuals or 54 people if all the chairs are filled. Don't panic if the number of chairs you want isn't available, just book the next size up. i.e. If you are an individual you may book into the first available group whether it is a single chair or not.
